UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE IN RHINELAND-PALATINATE

Wherever you travel in Rhineland-Palatinate, you will find extraordinary buildings, beautiful landscapes and living history. In Rhineland-Palatinate you can discover no less than seven UNESCO World Heritage Sites:

SPEYER CATHEDRAL

This impressive building is beyond all dimensions: It is the world's largest preserved Romanesque church, its crypt represents the largest European portico, and its ground plan influenced Romanesque architecture throughout Central Europe.


CULTURAL LANDSCAPE OF THE UPPER MIDDLE RHINE VALLEY



The Kaiserthermen were designed as one of the largest public baths of the Roman empire. With bathing and wandering halls, sauna and massage rooms the thermal baths were to provide relaxation to distinguished Romans – however, they were never completed. Declared UNESCO world heritage site, the mighty ruins – including an underground maze – today invite to take a discovery tour.




AMPHITHEATRE

IGELER COLUMN

MONUMENTAL MEMORIAL PLAQUE



It is among the best preserved death monuments of Roman times. A wealthy textile merchant's family had the 23 metre Igeler column built. Its reliefs depict scenes of daily work and mythological scenes, such as Ganymede's ascension with Jupiter's eagle – a symbol of hope for eternal life by the side of the Gods.


DISCOVERIES ON A GLOBAL SCALE



The greatest Roman gold treasure, splendid Roman mosaics, an ancient silver jug or the famous Diatret glass – the Rhine State Museum Trier hosts archaeological finds of world-class level. Experience the past of Trier and its surrounding from the Stone Age to Roman times, from the Frankish to the last principality era.

The abundance and quality of the artefacts from the Roman era – the period in which the city of Trier, as the official imperial residence of the Roman Empire, occupied its most significant position in its history – is truly unique. New finds from the excavations of the State Archaeology Department continually enrich the collection.





THE TRIER GOLD TREASURE IS BACK!

The discovery of the 18.5 kg find of pure gold in Trier in 1993 was considered a true sensation. It is the world's largest Roman gold coin treasure ever found. After an unsuccessful theft attempt in 2019, the coin cabinet was extensively renovated and redesigned. The museum's treasure chamber with the Trier gold treasure has opened its doors. Let yourself be captivated by the gold!






ONE OF EUROPE'S LARGEST FORTRESSES



This place is unique: For 3,000 years people had used the high rocky outcrop as refuge. From here the view extends from the Rhine, Deutsches Eck and the Moselle, all the way to the Neuwieder Becken. The fortress was built by Prussians and once among Europe's largest fortresses: metre-thick walls, ditches, tunnels, bridges and gates still dominate the enormous building complex to this day. Look forward to a unique cultural ensemble in the UNESCO world heritage area of the Upper Middle Rhine Valley.

The summer residence of Frederick William IV of Prussia was based on the plans of Karl Friedrich Schinkel and rises elegantly from the Rhine Valley's forested slopes. Significant murals and an originally preserved interior await you on the inside. Do not miss out on the palace gardens with the charming Pergola Garden. Also well worth seeing is the park landscaped designed by the prussian garden artist Peter Joseph Lenné with its grotto and waterfall.

STERRENBERG CASTLE

OLDEST PRESERVED CASTLE COMPLEX
IN THE MIDDLE RHINE VALLEY



Together with Liebenstein Castle, Sterrenberg Castle rests on a rocky spur, high above the Rhine. Thanks to their exciting past, the two fortifications received the names the "hostile brothers". Sterrenberg Castle that dates even farther back than 1100 AD is among the oldest hilltop castles in the Rhine Valley.




PFALZGRAFENSTEIN CASTLE

LIKE A SHIP OF STONE



Pfalzgrafenstein Castle imposingly rests in the middle of the river near Kaub on a rock reef in the Rhine. As watch castle it secured the income of its various noble owners. Together with the Marksburg the Pfalzgrafenstein is the only completely preserved castle in the UNESCO world heritage Upper Middle Rhine Valley and bears testimony to the meagre life of the men who once served here.

In the heart of Mainz, the State Museum invites you to take a journey through time – through the cultural history of Rhineland-Palatinate and far beyond.

As one of the oldest museums in Germany, it combines history with the present: the baroque "Golden Ross Barracks" and the former electoral stables provide a unique museum experience.

The collection is impressive: from golden jewellery, swords and Ro-

man stone monuments to medieval sculptures and contemporary art, it spans 200,000 years. Particularly worth seeing are the paintings from the Napoleonic collection and works by Picasso – real highlights of the tour. Renaissance, graphic art and modern art bring history to life.


LARGE GARDENS AS FAR AS THE EYE CAN SEE



Villa Ludwigshöhe Castle is located on a hill above the picturesque town of Edenkoben, surrounded by vineyards and protected by the Palatinate Forest Nature Park and Biosphere Reserve. Follow in the footsteps of Ludwig I of Bavaria. With this building, the aesthete fulfilled his dream of an "Italian-style villa, intended only for the beautiful season and located in the mildest part of the kingdom".

The classicist villa, reminiscent of ancient models, impresses with its precious hardwood floors and Pompeian ceiling and wall paintings.

The loggia offers a magnificent view far across the Palatinate and the Rhine valley.

TRIFELS CASTLE

THE MOST POWERFUL CASTLE OF THE STAUFERS



Between 1088 and 1330, Trifels Imperial Castle was one of the most important centres of power under the Staufers and Salier dynasties. The imperial regalia, such as the crown, sceptre and orb, were kept here. The castle also served as a prison. Its most famous prisoner was King Richard the Lionheart of England. From the plateau of the keep, you have a unique view of the Palatinate Forest.

Built in the 12th century, it turned into one of the Staufer's largest fortifications. The "last knight" Franz von Sickingen, once Lord of Nanstein, died in his castle after a violent siege.






ALTENBAUMBURG CASTLE RUINS






STATE MONUMENT PRESERVATION
